March 10- Conversing with Muslims about Christianity, Philip Walley will share about his personal experiences of sharing Christ with Muslims from around the world. Philip is a campus staff member of the International Student Ministry of Inter-varsity Christian Fellowship. This year we are focusing not just on praying to God, but how God moves in response to our prayers, and especially listening to God in prayer. Philip will discuss the importance of welcoming international students to our country and how his ministry seeks to connect them with Christ.

March 19- Listening Prayer (Presenter: Kent Walley) Join us for potluck supper at 6:30pm, with a presentation at 7:15pm which concludes by 8:30pm. How do we listen to God in prayer? While there is no set formula, there are great resources that have been handed down to us through the ages. This session will focus on the practice of contemplative prayer as it relates to listening to God. Theological, as well as Biblical rationale will be presented in addition to practical instruction.
March 31- On Death, Dying and Hospice Care - our Deacon Karen Lewis will be presenting thoughts on death, caring for a terminally ill loved one and about her ministry as a hospice chaplain.	March 26- "Prayer Together and Listening with Lectio Divina" Richard Somerset-Ward. It was George Herbert who referred to Prayer as "the Church's banquet", and he wrote a gorgeous poem about it. At this week's Lenten supper on Tuesday evening, Richard Somerset-Ward will examine two different sorts of prayer – public and private – the prayers we pray together in church and the prayers we pray in private. Do they have equal value? Is one more powerful than the other? In particular, he examines a way that Christians have used to pray for more than 1800 years – a way that is known by its Latin name, lectio divina. Join us in the Allen Room at 6:30 PM on Tuesday for potluck supper and Richard's talk, followed by small group discussions at your table.
April 7- The Opioid Crisis - Representatives from our Diocesan Recovery Commission, a local mental health organization and local law enforcement will be on hand to discuss this critical issue of our times.
