As we become closer friends with Jesus, we'll grow to be more like him. More patient, kind, caring, and forgiving.

We'll still mess up sometimes. And he'll still be our friend when we do. Because he's not our friend only when things go well; he's our friend *all* the time.



Create a sailor's hat. When you get home


...have family members take turns wearing the sailor's hat and answering the Talk Starter question.

Here's how:


1 Fold the paper in half as shown.




2 Fold in half again, then unfold.
